

Mt Gravatt Conservation Reserve

The Reserve, a remnant of once extensive bushland, now protects rare plant and animal species that, just 150 years ago, were widespread.

Identified in the 66 hectares of Mt Gravatt Conservation Reserve are:

- 279 native plant species = 11% of native species diversity in United Kingdom - 32 million hectares
- Koalas, Echidnas and Gliders (Squirrel and Sugar)
- 51 bird species
- 49 butterfly species
- Native bees - Stingless bees, Leafcutter, Teddy Bear and Blue-banded bees

The Reserve also contains headwaters of Mimosa/Bulimba and Ekibin/Norman Creeks, so our restoration work has an important role in maintaining water quality of these suburban creeks.

How can you help?

Volunteer some of your valuable time and effort to work with our teams restoring this unique habitat right in our “backyard.”

Take action to reduce key threats to the Reserve:

- Weeds/Garden Waste/Dumping
 - Don't dump your grass clippings or other green waste in bushland areas.
- Downhill Mountain Biking, Trail Bikes & Unofficial Tracks
 - Report illegal mountain biking and trail bikes to BCC Call Centre – 07 3403 8888
- Feral and Domestic Animals
 - Keep your dog on-leash and carry bags for dog droppings. Koalas avoid areas where they can smell dogs.
